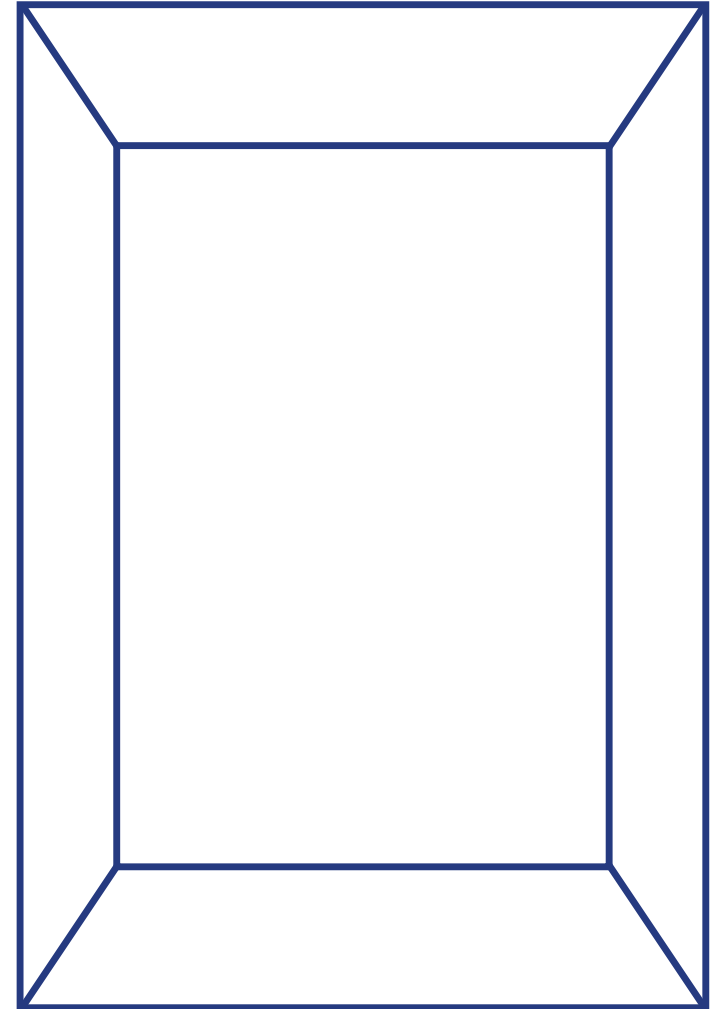



## Extension: From John Locke to Thomas Jefferson photo frame

- I can explain the major ideas of John Locke's political philosophy.
- I can identify ways that John Locke's *Second Treatise of Government* influenced the philosophies of Founders such as Thomas Jefferson.
- I can compare the key ideas included in John Locke's *Second Treatise of Government* with the Declaration of Independence.

Use the following directions and example to create your own photo and frame for either John Locke or Thomas Jefferson.

1. Draw a picture frame like the one shown below on your own paper. Your frame should take up the whole page.
2. In the center of the frame, draw John Locke or Thomas Jefferson. Do your best and be creative.
3. In the top section of the frame, write the name of the person you have chosen for your frame.
4. In the bottom section of the frame, write a phrase from your chosen person's work that illustrates his main idea(s).
5. On the left side, write what this quote means in your own words.
6. On the right side, write why this quote is important to good governance.
7. On the back, write how YOU should act to ensure that the concept of natural rights is faithfully applied.
